This sitting room and the adjacent three-season porch share a similar color palette and architectural details.

Perched on the shores of Lake Huron at the tip of Michigan's thumb, this historic cottage by Lucy Earl of **Jones-Keena & Co.** is the perfect spot to escape the hustle and bustle of metro Detroit. Originally an underused side deck, the porch was enclosed to become a three-season room. Architectural details like ceiling beams and dark wood flooring were added to echo the interior spaces. In addition to the expansive views of Lake Huron, the porch shares a deck with the adjacent sitting room. To connect the indoors and out, Lucy incorporated several of her client's antiques in both spaces and used abundant blues, whites, and browns to segue from lake to house seamlessly.





The enclosed porch features dining and lounge areas for visitors and weekend guests, with large windows and doors that capitalize on the whimsical natural lighting. Many of the small tables, bar cart, and accessories were sourced from local antique stores.
